## **Cincinnati SportsMedicine & Orthopaedic Center Physicians Integral Part of 2008 AAOS Annual Convention**

**San Francisco, Calif.**— A number of orthopaedic physicians at Cincinnati SportsMedicine and Orthopaedic Center, participated in the year's largest orthopaedic international meeting held in San Francisco, CA, the Annual Meeting of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS). March 5-7, 2008.

Dr. Noyes, a board certified orthopaedic surgeon specializing in sports medicine and other orthopaedic problems, was joined by fellow Cincinnati SportsMedicine physician Dr. Marc T. Galloway for a lecture entitled "Advanced Applications of MRI in Sports Medicine and Orthopaedics." Dr. Galloway was the 2007 recipient of the AAOS Kappa Delta Award, the most prestigious award in the field of orthopaedic research.

Dr. Noyes also moderating and participated in a seminar entitled "Complex Knee Ligament Instabilities and Revisions: A Case Series Approach." Additionally, Dr. Noyes was selected to participate in an Arthroscopy Association of North America seminar entitled "Correcting Malalignment: Optimizing your Surgical Approach to Proximal Tibial Osteotomy." Dr. Noyes was the first physician in the Greater Cincinnati Area to perform a computer-assisted osteotomy this past fall.

Dr. V. James Sammarco and his father, Dr. G. James Sammarco moderated and participated in a seminar entitled: "Techniques in Hallux Valgus (Bunion) Surgery." Both Drs. Sammarco have been pioneers in the treatment of Hallux Valgus. Dr. G. James Sammarco developed a technique for the correction of the bunion deformity that was adopted internationally, while Dr. V. James Sammarco recently published a new surgical technique for Hallux Valgus correction that has proven to be extremely stable.

Dr. Matthew L. Busam, Cincinnati SportsMedicine's newest physician and a 1993 graduate of Elder High School, joined the Cincinnati SportsMedicine's impressive list of involvement in the AAOS National convention with his presentation entitled "Prospective Evaluation of Concurrent Meniscus Transplantation and Articular Cartilage Repair."
