### ***Dr. Frank R. Noyes Elected to the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine Hall of Fame***

Cincinnati— Frank Noyes, M.D., one of the nation's premier knee surgeons and President and Medical Director of Cincinnati SportsMedicine & Orthopaedic Center, will be inducted into the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM) Hall of Fame at the organization's annual convention in July, 2008 in Orlando, Florida.

In 2001, the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM) established the Hall of Fame to honor members of the orthopaedic sports medicine community who have contributed significantly to the specialty and set themselves apart. This is the Society's highest accolade, reserved for outstanding leaders in sports medicine and service as team physicians. Nominations are submitted by AOSSM members and reviewed by and selected by the Hall of Fame Subcommittee.

Dr. Noyes is a board certified orthopaedic knee surgeon and an internationally known expert on the diagnosis and treatment of knee problems. He is a prolific researcher, publishing over 200 studies and articles in the world's top orthopaedic journals. He is a member of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and has served on a number of editorial boards, including The American Journal of Sports Medicine, Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery, and the Journal of Orthopaedics and Sports Physical Therapy. His accomplishments have earned him nearly every award presented in the field of orthopaedic and sports medicine research, including the Kappa Delta Award – the highest award presented by the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons in the field of research.

Dr. Noyes is regularly consulted by the national and local media for his expertise on the understanding and prevention of serious knee injuries in female athletes. In conjunction with a team of athletic trainers, physical therapists and researchers, he developed Sportsmetrics™, the first training program scientifically proven to decrease serious knee ligament injuries in female athletes. The Sportsmetrics™ program has been featured in national and international media, including the New York Times, ESPN Wide World of Sports, Health, and on Good Morning America

Dr. Noyes is the former medical director for the University of Cincinnati athletic teams, former chairman of the United States Soccer Federation's Sports Medicine Advisory Committee and former team physician for the Cincinnati Bengals.
